Michelle is Pittsburg born and raised, and she previously spent some time at Bridge Y.C. as their bartender.

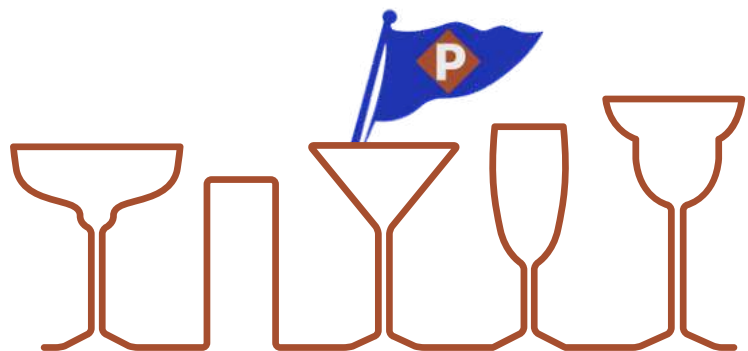
As a highlight, you might remember the Red Caboose in Antioch; Michelle and her mother were the owners.

“Any activity that you take part in where something can inadvertently get in your eye is an activity in which you want to wear glasses”

Almost everyone will encounter a situation where they should really wear eye protection. This is true for everything from yard work to sports to basic household chores.

When foreign particles get into an eye, they can damage the sensitive membranes of your eyeball, leading to irritation, light sensitivity, and infection.

Most safety glasses are made from polycarbonate and are designed to keep everything that might come flying at your face away from your sensitive eyes.

Sunglasses or eyeglass lenses made from glass or plastic are occasionally helpful for this, but, unlike polycarbonate, these elements risk shattering and causing more problems since the shards can scratch or become embedded in the eyeball.

American National Standards Institute (ANSI) Z87.1+ rating specifies that the glasses will, among other things, protect against small particles traveling up to 150 feet per second.

With safety glasses, you can find markings either on the sidearm of the frames or on the right side of the lens. If the eyewear passed the high impact standard, you will see a “+” next to the Z87 or W marking on the sidearm or you'll see a W+ on the lens.

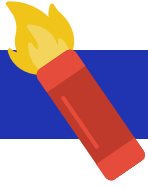
Mission Statement

All about those flares!

What Are Marine Flares?

A marine flare is a type of pyrotechnic device that produces a brilliant light or a plume of colorful smoke as a visual distress signal to attract attention in an emergency, and to help pinpoint the boater's exact location.

What Type of Boaters Need to Carry Onboard Marine Flares?

The U.S. Coast Guard requires vessels longer than 16 feet operating on coastal waters, the Great Lakes, territorial seas, and waters directly connected to them (up to the point where the body of water is less than two miles wide) to carry Coast Guard approved visual distress signals.

Exceptions are:

- Recreational boats less than 16 feet in length.
- Open sailboats less than 26 feet in length and not equipped with propulsion machinery
- Manually propelled boats

Why Carry Visual Distress Signals, i.e., Marine Flares?

The Coast Guard requires boaters to carry 3 daytime and 3 nighttime use flares. Only 3 need be aboard if approved for both daytime and nighttime use.

Red-colored handheld and aerial pyrotechnic flares are approved for both daytime and nighttime use.
Orange-colored flares are approved for daytime use only.

The average shelf life for pyrotechnic flares is between 36 and 42 months from the manufacture date. Failure to have flares or having expired flares could result in a \$1,100 fine.

Why Are Marine Flares Hazardous?

Pyrotechnic flares contain toxic metals and pollutants such as perchlorate which is recognized as a water and health pollutant that can impact our waterways and can impair thyroid's function.

Why Are Expired Marine Flares an Issue in Our State?

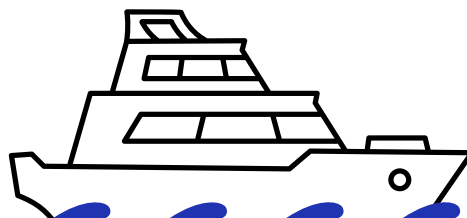
Expired marine flares are hazardous wastes, are transported as explosives and must be disposed of at a hazardous waste facility permitted by the EPA to manage explosives.

What Are the Current Disposal Options for Expired Marine Flares?

For disposal of expired marine flares, please contact the California Department of Toxic Substances Control (800) 728-6942) or your local Certified Unified Program Agency (<https://cersapps.calepa.ca.gov/public/directory/>) for assistance.

Recommended Best Practices for Marine Pyrotechnic Flares Disposal

Never put flares in the regular trash or in any waterway, it is illegal!
Never fire a flare if it is not an emergency! This is a federal crime and will be punished as such.
